<u>Year 1</u> Accelerate the progress of the pupil premium children in year 1 to ensure that 54% of Pupil Premium children reach the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined by July 2022. Context 40% of the year 1 cohort are pupil premium. Of this cohort 35% are International New Arrival Pupils.
